We are soon to be adding louvered vents to the attic (a long deferred task), which will bring the building up to code and help cool it in summer months.

The preschool, Grace School, which had to close before it was able to finish its first year, has been getting refreshed as well. The school's director, Amy Maria, is planning to

extend the academic program to include kindergarten! That will be a blessing, especially for her first student who can now return for another year.

Next up will be fencing in the backyard area for the playground and church functions and activities. If any would like to help with some digging and yard work, I'd appreciate that, and so would my back.

Perhaps you have noticed, the church website has been getting some updating; please check it out. We had a webcam and tripod donated which has helped with live-streaming our Sunday services. Soon, weather permitting, we'll be filming outdoors in the garden.

Several weeks ago I submitted applications for numerous relief grants. I'm happy to report that we just received one in the amount of \$12,500. That is certainly a big help and blessing.

I would also like to thank all of you who have been continuing with your donations to the church during this difficult time. Our expenses are a bit less, but not by that much, as most of our utilities are spread out for the year, so they remain the same, as does the mortgage. Again, I ask only if you're able to, to please contribute. If any are able to help with yard work, spring cleaning, etc., please let me know and we can arrange some socially distanced time at the church.
